#### Call to Order

Chairperson Shannon Barton Stark called the meeting to order at 4:30 P.M.

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#### Consideration of any Changes, Addition, or Removal to the Agenda

Logan Nicoll said I think we need an additional executive session for a contract matter.

1. MOTION by Logan Nicoll and seconded by Jean Strong for an additional executive session for a contract matter. Motion passed unanimously.

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# **Comments from Ratepayers**

Shannon Barton Stark stated we will now accept comments from ratepayers. Are there any ratepayers here.

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David Rose stated I have a couple of questions. Are there any plans to work on your tariffs.

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Shannon Barton Stark stated yes.

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David Rose stated there are, good. Because we're trying to encourage heat pumps and electric cars and things, but the rub is what your current tariff is if you use more than 2000kw for just two months, you get kicked up, so that's something that's...

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Shannon Barton Stark stated to an on-demand and something we discussed in the last meeting, actually.

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Logan Nicoll stated we did, yes. We discussed the timeline is a little tricky because you're not allowed to consider a tariff change and a rate increase, and so they had tried to pursue a rate increase within the past 6 months, which was partially successful. We didn't get the full rate increase that they were looking for and so the administrative office was really hoping to do a further rate increase really to bring things in line with where they need to be, but we can't really do a tariff change if we're going to do that, and so there was some discussion about, you know, how we attack both those.

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David Rose said right, because I think that tariff is back from the 70s and 80s when you tried to get folks off of electric heat. And the other question is, I've heard on the street that, a couple of questions for you. Are there security cameras at the maintenance shop; have they been turned off and if so, why would they be turned off. I heard that at the coffee shop.

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Logan Nicoll stated I mean, I think there was, we don't have a policy, I think is one of the bigger pictures for me. The security cameras predated me; they were installed before I had been on this board. I think it was an issue to me that I had heard from out employees that they were not really clear on what the

cameras were used for and why they got put in and they felt like they did not like the security cameras; they felt like they were being watched, and so from my position, I wanted the cameras removed or turned off because we didn't have a very clear outlined policy on what they were for, when they were used, how they could be viewed, under what circumstances people were able to watch them or review them and so I wanted them removed until we could outline a clear policy over who was able to look at them, who was able to review them and who was able to look at the footage.

David Rose asked wouldn't that be a security concern though. Someone breaks in now; I mean you got nothing there. I mean, I think cameras are everywhere. They're in this building, they're all over. Wherever you go, you're on camera, I don't know why people would be...are they in the building so they were like in an area where the guys were.

Shannon Barton Stark stated no, they were outside of the building and what we're working on now, which is in the process of working on, something I'm doing. Having the security of the person who is in charge of the shop having access to the cameras, which was not happening. So, the superintendent of the shop should have access to the cameras. He did not. It was only the office manager who had access, so therefore right now, what we're trying to do is get the access transferred to the superintendent, who is the boss of the shop.

David Rose stated I would think that you'd have both of them look at them.

Shannon Barton Stark stated they could both have access, but at this point, it was just one person with access, so therefore it was shut down for a very short time while we transfer the security codes. And I agree with you, we should have cameras.

Shannon Barton Stark stated it's better to work under camera anyway.

David Rose said in this day in age, you walk into the Shaw's you're on, you know.

Shannon Barton Stark stated you should, it keeps people honest and I'm all for cameras, that was not the situation on why they were shut down.

Logan Nicoll said I think for me, it's more important just that there's clear policies. I think that just having a system in place, making sure that we know who was looking at them and why, and that they're not... I mean in theory, they could be open to the public at request, but just that not everybody can see them at all times or that there's some sort of system in place surrounding them.

Shannon Barton Stark stated there's also laws with municipalities that I've been looking into about being under camera and that it really being a municipality, that you can't be just looking at the cameras all day long; there has to be a reason. Because you're working for a town, there is a law about that, so therefore some of that plays into it as well. It has to be almost recorded; I believe. Do you know anything about that. Sarah and I spoke a little bit about that.

Ron Shems stated it can't just be entertainment.

Shannon Barton Stark stated right. In which it was being abused.

David Rose said it was being abused as entertainment. Does the town and village have a policy on that.

Brendan McNamara stated we do not, but as a municipality, generally speaking, we're a public entity so if somebody walks in here with a camera, they can film it. So, you really, as a public entity, have no expectation of privacy.

Shannon Barton Stark asked anything else.

David Rose stated no, that's all I've got.

Shannon Barton Stark asked for any other comments from ratepayers.

**Executive Session (Appointment of Interim Department Director)** Shannon Barton Stark stated I will now take a motion to move into executive session for two matters. Logan Nicoll stated I will amend my motion to say interim department manager. MOTION by Logan Nicoll and seconded by Jean Strong to extend a job offer to Chris Recchia, with terms to be negotiated with the chair and legal counsel of a salary consistent with the current salary for the interim department manager at 24 hours per week, plus benefits and mileage. Motion passed unanimously. 

Shannon Barton Stark stated the motion carries, thank you.

Logan Nicoll stated on the second executive session, I will make a motion that we allow the chair and legal counsel to negotiate terms and authorize them to sign a contract regarding the safety audit.
